The Dubugue Arboretum and Botanical Gardens have been a part of the Dubuque community since 1980. Quietly nestled on the city's northwest side and featuring more than 60 types of gardens (including Rose, Hosta, English, Japanese, Herb and more), the grounds continue to grow and expand every year. Completely volunteer created and maintained, these floral displays will wow any nature lover! Be sure to walk by the koi pond for some pictures, too!

Eagle Point Park is a 164 acre public park, located in the northeast corner of the city. Eagle Point is mostly situated on a bluff that overlooks the Mississippi River and Lock and Dam #11. The park features stunning views of Iowa, Illinois, and Wisconsin! Watch boat traffic move through the lock, see the goldfish pond, and keep your eye out for bald eagles, too!

Guests will be provided with a map of both locations in case your preference is to walk around on your own rather than accompanying the guide for a stroll.
